Section 3: Hazards Identification

Potential Acute Health Effects:

Extremely hazardous in case of ingestion. Hazardous in case of skin contact (irritant, permeator), of eye contact (irritant), of inhalation. Severe over-exposure can result in death.

Section 4: First Aid Measures

Eye Contact:

Storage:

Keep container tightly closed. Keep container in a cool, well-ventilated area. Refrigerate. Do not store above 8°C (46.4°F). Sensitive to light. Store in light-resistant containers. Air Sensitive.
